"May the work I've Done Speak for Me"

Thomas Porter Caldwell was born in Charlotte, North Carolina to Mattie and the late Melvin Caldwell, and he was number three of eight children. He received his elementary education at First Ward School and later received his secondary education at Second Ward High School where his leadership qualities were revealed to the world. At Second Ward, he served as President of the Student Council and later served as State President of the North Carolina Association of Student Councils. He participated in various activities such as: Football, Basketball, Track, Drama, Choir, Orchestra, National Conference of Christians and Jews; and he was a proud member of the Esquire Social Club.

After graduation, he entered Shaw University where he continued his interest in the performing arts. While at Shaw he was elected Vice President of the National Association of Speech and Dramatics Arts, the highest position a student could obtain. He received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Political Science in 1972. He continued his educational experience at Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey and Fairleigh Dickerson University in East Rutherford, New Jersey.

At an early age, Thomas joined Ebenezer Baptist Church where he participated in the Youth Choir, Boy Scouts and the Junior Missionary Department. When he moved to New Jersey, he affiliated himself with the Gethsemane Baptist Church of Newark, NJ. Upon his retirement, he reunited with Ebenezer where he served as a Trustee, Missionary, member of the Finance Committee and the Christian Education Department. Thomas knew the importance of Christian values and education. On Father's Day, he would rally his sisters and brother to donate to the Scholarship Fund in memory of their father.

Thomas was employed by the New Jersey Department of Labor for 35 years. He retired as Assistant Director of the Division of Programs and Services. He was a member of the International Association of Personnel in Employment Security where he served on the International Board of Directors and led a Labor exchange to the Republic of China and Japan.

Thomas was an avid golfer and traveled to Myrtle Beach with his Jersey friends to play golf annually.

In his community, Thomas served on the Steele Creek Landing Home Owners Association as Secretary Treasurer and formerly served as Secretary of Precinct #229, Democratic Party.
